【概要】 As a liberal arts course, Ethics in English is intended foster skills in critical thinking and communication. The relevance of ethics to life in general and medical practice in particular makes the study of ethics a useful subject for these purposes.

【学習目標】 Student who fully participate in this course will improve their ability to:

- Find reliable sources of information — online and in print — and use these sources to study ethical issues relevant to life in general and medical practice in particular.
- Form teams and work together on scholarly topics of shared interest.
- Communicate their knowledge and their beliefs, and be clear about the difference.
- Organize, advertise, and deliver ethics seminars open to the entire FMU community.

【教科書】 【参考書】 Specific materials will depend on the ethics-related topics that student groups choose to investigate. Students should therefore expect to pay some costs related to acquiring and/or copying (ethically!) relevant materials.

【成績評価方法】

As teamwork and cooperation are essential throughout the course, it will be essential to attend all class sessions. Health-related absences must be appropriately documented. The overall success of a student team will be measured by what its members accomplish, mainly, the organization and delivery of an ethics seminar in September, open to the entire FMU community. The number of attendees they attract, and performance assessments made by those attendees, will comprise a significant part of the evaluation. Individual efforts contributing to the overall success of a student team will be judged in accord with the duties assigned to and accepted by each student on the team.

【学習上の注意事項】 Enrollment in this active learning class will be limited to a total of 24, which may include students from other universities. Unethical behaviors, including acts of plagiarism, are grounds for failing the course.
