【概要】 As a liberal arts course, FLIP is intended foster critical thinking, active learning, and effective communication through the study of relevant topics chosen by students themselves.

【学習目標】 Student who fully participate in this course will improve their ability to:

- Understand the scope of activities and topics that exist within the liberal arts
- Identify and describe a scholarly liberal arts activity that they would like to do
- “Learn how to learn” by developing their own multi-day curriculum
- Accept and act on constructive guidance from teaching staff

【教科書】【参考書】 Specific materials will depend on the topics that student groups choose to investigate. Students should therefore expect to pay some costs related to acquiring and/or copying (ethically!) relevant materials.

【成績評価方法】

As teamwork and cooperation are essential throughout the course, it will be essential to attend all class sessions. Health-related absences must be appropriately documented. The overall success of a student team will be measured by what its members accomplish. It is recommended that at least some part of the chosen activity be a scholarly event open to members of the FMU academic community and perhaps a broader public audience. Individual efforts contributing to the overall success of a student team will be judged in accord with the duties assigned to and accepted by each student on the team.

【学習上の注意事項】 The number of participants in this active learning class will be determined by consensus of participating students and teaching staff, with due consideration to how each student can earn academic credit equal to or greater than the number of scheduled class hours.

A guidance document will be made available well in advance of the day (tentatively, July 1) when students are to present their liberal arts study proposals.

Unethical behaviors, including acts of plagiarism, are grounds for failing the course.
