CORE concepts: CO-authorship and RE-writing

Professor Kenneth Nollet, Office of International Cooperation of Radiation Medical Science Center & Department of Blood Transfusion and Transplantation Immunology, Fukushima Medical University

This presentation will build on the 2021 March 20 presentation, “From Review to Readership: Getting Attention and Action,” with recent examples of initial and follow-up correspondence with academic journal editors and reviewers. “CORE Concepts” will also review co-authorship guidelines, such as those of the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) and various academic publishers.

Steps to submit an article to an international journal

A scientific article to be published successfully in prestigious scientific journals needs to have all 3 elements:
Good Science + Good writing + Good publishing strategy

A. STEP 1: WRITING A DRAFT ARTICLE Following the “IMRAD” structure

B. STEP 2: Find a journal to submit and follow the guidance of that selected journal

B1. Carefully read the Submission guidelines of the selected journal

B2. Fully prepare all files for submission: Manuscript, Table, Figure, Appendix, Cover letter, Check list of provided by the journal.

B3. Confirm ORCID registration of all authors

B4. Check the order in which the author's name appears on the article. Check author information: name order in English, place of work, contact address, e-mail, phone number.

B5. Have a Suggested Reviewers List ready before submitting

B6. Register an author account on the website of the journal to be submitted

B7. Proceed with all the details presented on the official website of the selected journal.

B8. Check your personal email carefully for journal responses to make timely adjustments or additions to the manuscript as required by the journal.

Upon completion of submission, follow up to receive the edited manuscript from the journal.
