





## The Third Training-of-Trainers in Fukushima: Activity Report

The third Evidenced-based Medicine Training-of-Trainers (EBM-TOT) was held at Fukushima Medical University School of Medicine, Department of Public Health, Japan, November 15-22, 2015 (including international and domestic travels). This was the third EBM-TOT co-organized by the Department of Public Health of Fukushima Medical University School of Medicine and University of Medicine and Pharmacy, Ho Chi Minh City. The course was sponsored by the JICA Partnership Program, and supported by the Ho Chi Minh City Medical Association, Ho Chi Minh City Health Service, Japan Epidemiological Association and Fukushima Prefecture. The course targeted a total of 10 university lecturers and mid- to senior-level clinical instructors in Ho Chi Minh City, and offered a basic training in managing and teaching research methodology courses. The primary objectives of this course were to expose trainees to various types of interactive training modules and to teach a new research method (qualitative research).

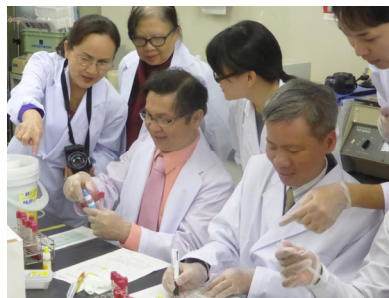
The training course started on Monday (16th) at JICA Tokyo International Center. Pictures below present lively images of the major activities during the one week intensive training.
