# Selection of students who have received an overseas education program

# (Excerpt version)

### 1. Number of selected students

A few students.

### 2. Qualifications for applicants

Those who meet all of the following conditions (1) and (2).

(1) Of the 12-year course in school education, those who have been enrolled or are expected to be enrolled in a school located in a foreign country for two years or more, including the period equivalent to a high school in Japan.

However, the period of enrollment in an overseas education facility accredited or designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology as having a course equivalent to that of a high school is not considered to have received school education in a foreign country.

- (2) Those who fall under any of the following and can submit qualification certificates, transcripts, etc. within 3 years after acquisition, at the time of application.
- a) Those who have acquired the International Baccalaureate Diploma awarded by the International Baccalaureate Secretariat, which is a foundation based on the Swiss Civil Code.
- b) Those who have obtained the Abitur qualification recognized as a university entrance qualification in each state of the Federal Republic of Germany.
- c) Those who have acquired the Baccalaureate Diploma, which is recognized as a university entrance qualification in the Republic of France.
- d) Those who have GCE Advanced level, which is recognized as a university entrance qualification in the UK, have passed 3 subjects in mathematics, physics, chemistry, and biology at GCE Advanced level, and have passed the remaining 1 subject (subject that does not overlap with Advanced level) at the GCE Advanced Subsidiary level or the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE).
- e) Those who have taken the SAT Reasoning Test (SAT I) and SAT Subject Tests (SAT II), (excluding SAT Essay), which are hosted by the College Board in the United States, in the United States or other regions (including Japan), and have completed or are expected to complete a 12-year course in school education.

#### 3. Selection method

Selection will be made on the basis of an overall consideration of the results of comprehensive tests, interviews, and application documents.

Therefore, even if the total score of the comprehensive tests exceeds the minimum score required of successful applicants, it may not qualify for selection.

(Note 1) Comprehensive Test I is a descriptive test that mainly tests basic knowledge of science and mathematics (which is essential knowledge for receiving medical education at university), as well as logical thinking ability, and that includes questions in English. Comprehensive Test II is a descriptive test that mainly tests logical and multifaceted thinking and expressiveness. (Note 2) The University Admission Common Test is not imposed.

(Note 1) The result of the interview (60 points allotted) will be utilized in the overall evaluation.

(Note 2) Application documents will be utilized for the overall evaluation. It will not be scored.
